A new identity for a mission that continues to grow in Bolivia

During the first half of 2026, an important institutional milestone was achieved: the official approval and registration of our new name, Fundación Visión, at the local level, marking the beginning of a new chapter in our history.

This change represents much more than a renewal of our identity. It means moving toward greater integration of our institutional image with the international network we are part of, strengthening the link with our headquarters in Paraguay, an organization with more than three decades of experience and a strong reputation, and with the Fundación Visión office in the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

The new name allows us to project a shared identity, strengthening the Foundations international recognition and consolidating a common mission: bringing quality eye care closer to the local community and generating a positive impact on peoples quality of life.

This process represents a natural evolution of our institution, while preserving the values that have accompanied us since our beginnings.



A historic first half: 2,256 patients treated and 230 surgeries performed

During the first half of 2026, Fundación Visión Bolivia strengthened its commitment to the visual health of the population, achieving results that reflect the sustained growth of our care programs and the impact generated in hundreds of people.

During this period, 2,256 patients received eye care and 230 surgeries were performed, both at our clinic in Santa Cruz and through outreach campaigns carried out in different locations across the country. These results are the outcome of the coordinated work of our medical, administrative and support teams, together with the support of partner institutions that help expand access to specialized services.

Our work remains focused on three fundamental objectives:

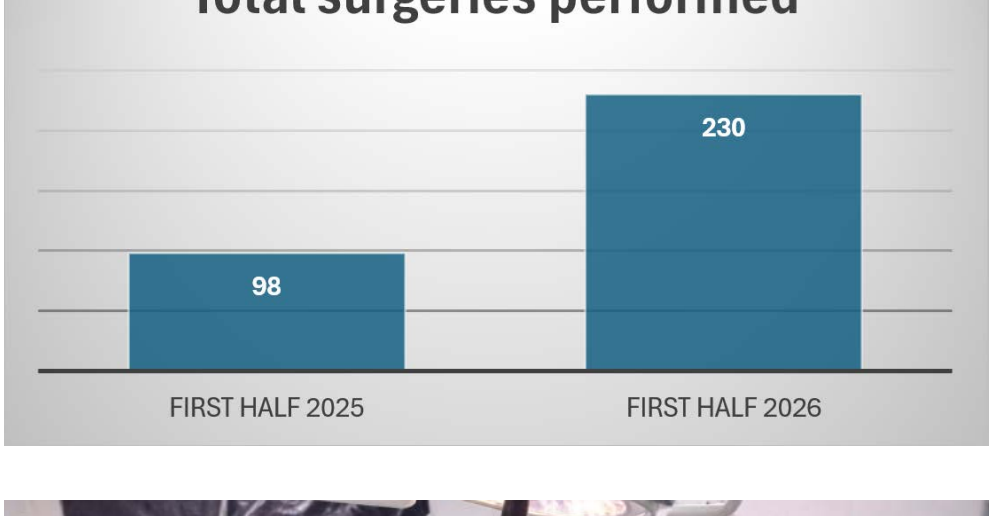
- Provide timely, quality eye care.
- Promote prevention and early detection of eye diseases.
- Bring specialized services closer to populations facing greater barriers to access.

Every patient we treat represents an opportunity to prevent, treat and transform a life through the recovery or protection of vision.



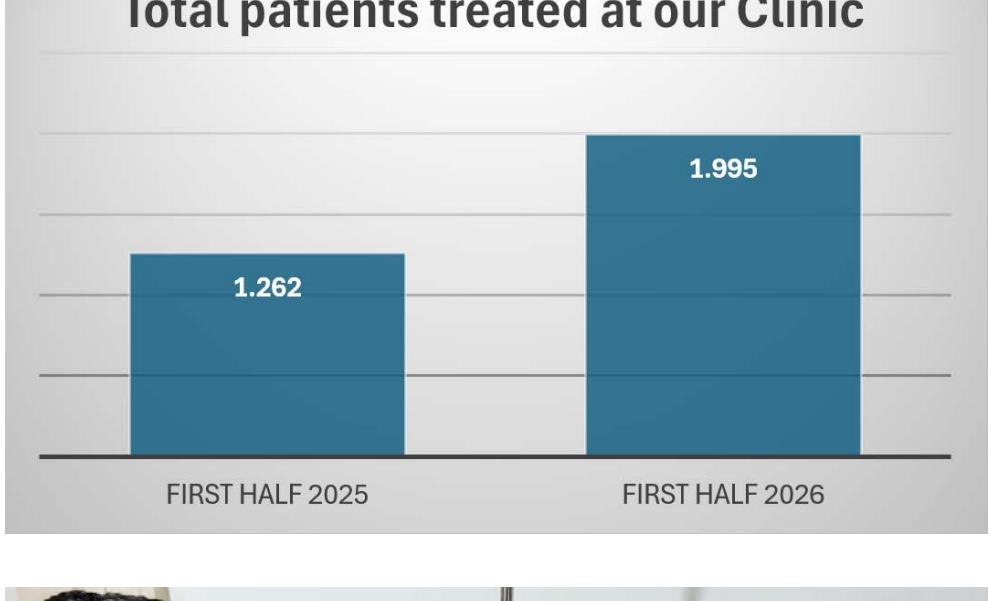
**Ophthalmic surgeries grew by 135%:
230 procedures performed in six months**

One of the main achievements of the first half of 2026 was the growth experienced in surgical procedures. During this period, 230 ophthalmic surgeries were performed, compared with 98 during the first half of 2025, representing an increase of 135%. This significant progress reflects the strengthening of our services, greater response capacity and the commitment of our professional team to provide timely solutions to patients requiring surgical treatment. Behind every surgery is a story of transformation: a person who regains vision, independence and quality of life, together with a family that once again has new opportunities.



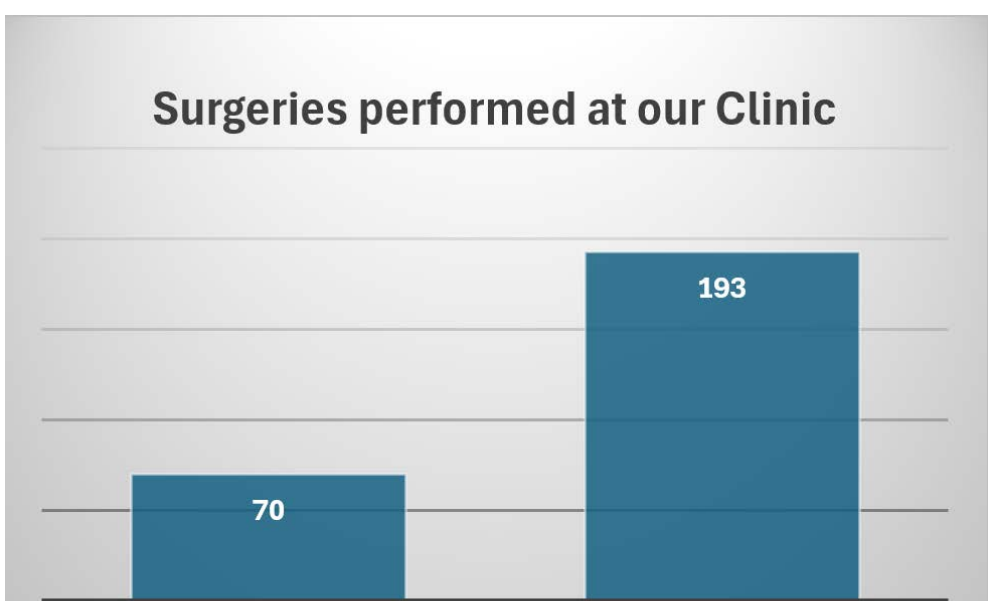
**58% more patients treated
at our clinic in Santa Cruz**

During the first half of 2026, our clinic in Santa Cruz provided eye care to 1,995 people, consolidating its role as a specialized referral center for the community. This figure represents a 58% increase compared with the same period in 2025, when 1,262 patients were treated. Care included ophthalmology consultations, check-ups, surgical evaluations and postoperative follow-up, providing comprehensive support from prevention and diagnosis through treatment. This growth demonstrates patients increasing trust in our services and the Foundations ongoing commitment to providing accessible, safe and quality care.



**Ophthalmic surgeries at our clinic
grew by 176% in the first half of 2026**

The growth in surgical activity at our Santa Cruz clinic was one of the periods most notable results. During the first six months of 2026, 193 surgical procedures were performed, including cataract and pterygium surgeries and other specialize ophthalmic treatments. This represents a 176% increase compared with the first half of 2025, when 70 surgeries were performed. These results reflect the consolidation of our medical teams, the strengthening of our healthcare infrastructure and our ability to provide surgical solutions to an increasing number of patients. Each procedure represents a concrete opportunity to improve vision and restore the independence of those who place their trust in our institution.

Visual health closer to those who need it most: 261 patients treated through campaigns

As part of Fundación Visión Bolivia commitment to equitable access to eye health, during the first half of 2026 we carried out ophthalmology campaigns outside our clinic, reaching communities with greater difficulties in accessing care. Through these initiatives, 261 patients received consultations, evaluations and ophthalmic diagnoses. The campaigns were carried out in:

- Villa Nueva
- Clínica Labosur Yacuiba
- Mano Amiga
- Ixiamas
- San Borja
- Trinidad

These campaigns made it possible to detect eye conditions early, guide patients regarding their treatment and bring specialized care closer to people who, in many cases, face significant economic barriers.

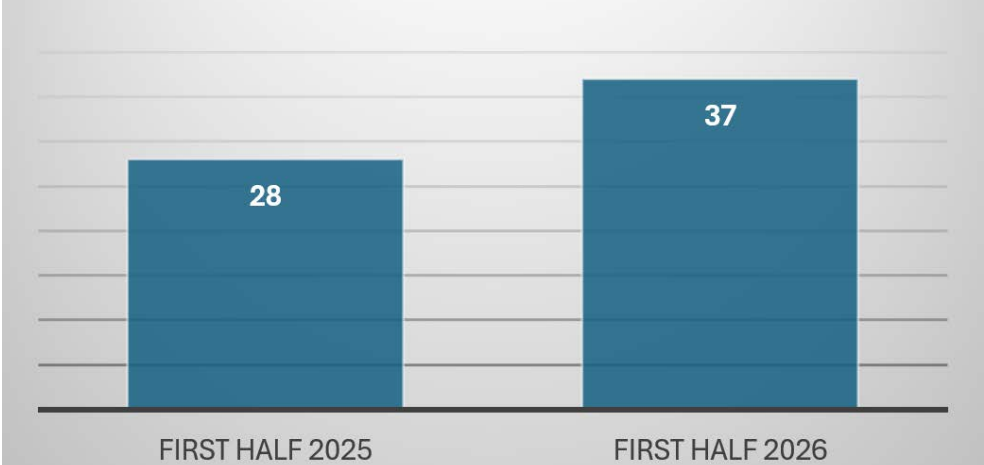

Outreach surgeries grew by 32% and brought solutions to patients in remote communities

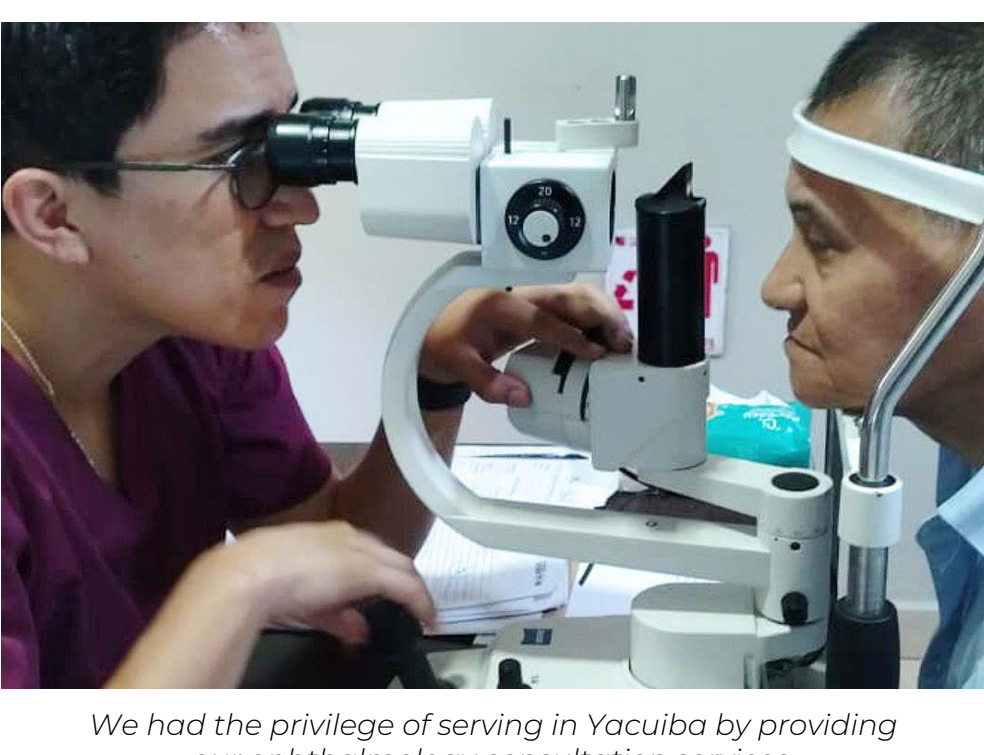
The outreach work we carried out made it possible to identify patients who required surgical treatment and provide them with a concrete solution to improve their vision. During the first half of 2026, 37 patients underwent ophthalmic surgery after being identified through the campaigns conducted by the Foundation. This represents a 32% increase compared with the same period in 2025, when 28 outreach surgeries were performed. Most of the beneficiaries were people with limited financial resources, who were able to access safe and timely procedures thanks to the comprehensive support provided by our team.
